Bob DesPain's Address to the Board

Mr. DesPain: Good evening, Bob DesPain, Collinsville. This Madison County Board is again given more improvement opportunities about transparency along with the compliance of the Freedom of Information Act. Obtaining transparency is found by use of the act. Last board meeting used the word "party" instead of a name, but now I not only know her name being Vanessa Jones...

Mr. Dunstan: Sir, under our dignity in our meetings that you are not allowed to use names or personnel references or anything of that nature. It is in our rules. You are not allowed to do that. You can talk about an elected official; you are not allowed to talk about an employee. If you would like to see the information, I have it right here to see.

Mr. DesPain: I would like a copy of that. You know about the first amendment?

Mr. Dunstan: Yes, I do know about the first amendment. You are not allowed to say any names.

Mr. DesPain: I also know that person had a pay increase of 8.9%.

Mr. Dunstan: You are bringing up personal items up again. I will not allow you to do that. You can talk about me all you want, I will be glad if you talked about me. I am an elected official, talk about me all you want, talk about Mr. Gibbons all you want. Do not talk about our employees.

Mr. DesPain: I suspect there are many residents in your particular district that wish they would have received a 9% salary increase last year. Another FOIA request was made for the documents pertaining to the purchase of a podium, the director of administration replied that my request was denied and no such record could be found. That is unreasonable. Section 9 of the act says "each public body shall notify the requestor of the reason for the denial and the person responsible for the denial. The highest ranking appointed employee violated the act. Not receiving the podium records I then requested the application for the authority to dispose records. The director replied the copies came from the county clerk. He noted that he had complied for records from other departments with accordance of the county board resolution appointing FOIA officers. Having only 3 minutes here, I took longer and I am sorry for that. I am brief in saying; he said he was the FOIA officer for only the county board. His message asked me that I direct specific requests to the department in accordance with the board resolution designating the FOIA officer for each of the departments. The powerful public servant ended by assuming the minimization of tax payers' expense by complying with my request. Power tends to corrupt and absolute power corrupts absolutely.
